Judging Guidelines

If a specific subject is given to photograph does the photo fit the subject given/chosen?

<u>Impact</u>

Does it grab your attention (Look at it for more than one second !) Does it excite your imagination ? (Makes you laugh , cry , sad ?) Does it show a familiar subject in a new way ? Does it show an unusual subject in an effective way ?

Composition

Is the cropping of the subject effective ? Is the alignment correct? Or is it crooked by intent? Are there leading lines taking the eye into the photo?

Technical

Focus :	Is the image sharp ? Is it intentionally soft ?
Depth of field : Is the main subject sharp? Is the background out of	
focus to make the main subject stand out?	
Density :	Is it too light ? Too dark ? Just right ?
Lighting :	Is the lighting effective ? Too dark ? Just right ? Do the
shadows add to, or detract from the photo?	
Colours :	Does it have a strange colour cast ? If black and white
	is it too greyish ? Is that intentional ?
Manipulation :	Obvious signs of bad manipulation such as pixilation ?
Printing :	Lines or banding caused by blocked printer heads or
	Running out of ink

<u>Presentation</u>

Physical : Is the print free of finger prints , scratches, creases, dust, spots, stains ?

Paper choice may also play a part in the impact of the photograph.

For judging of a photo ignore the borders it may enhance the photo but it is the photo you are judging.
